This role involves planning, organizing, and facilitating community-based recreational, social, and educational activities for Indigenous children, youth, and families. The position offers hands-on experience in community services, cultural studies, and youth engagement, with a focus on fostering cultural connection and community building.

Key Duties and Responsibilities

1. Research, plan, and deliver culturally relevant program activities.
2. Assist in developing and running summer day camps for the Indigenous program.
3. Supervise and support participants in program activities.
4. Create a welcoming, safe space for cultural and artistic expression.
5. Help coordinate and execute special events.
6. Develop and implement a social media plan (e.g., Instagram content, client personas, posting schedules).
7. Complete administrative tasks, including record-keeping and reporting.
8. Perform other duties as assigned by the Society.



Qualifications:

- Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or protected refugee entitled to work in Canada.
- Full-time student in the previous academic year or enrolled for upcoming September.
